Thank you for creating space for us. Thank you for seeing our scattered thoughts, our imposter syndrome, our fragments of doubt, and still saying, "Come on in." Thank you for seeing our ordinary selves with anxious concerns and unflattering habits and saying, "I have bigger plans for you." Thank you for seeing our fragile egos, and our uncertain relationships, and saying, "You still belong here."

Your expansive love makes room for us to breathe, and we want to love with our lungs and hearts full. So today we pray—teach us how to make that same room for others.

# GivingTuesday on Nov. 29 will again celebrate the collective power of Presbyterian generosity

GivingTuesday was originally launched in 2012 on the Tuesday after Thanksgiving as a philanthropic response to the consumer-driven holidays of Black Friday and Cyber Monday.

So here's how it works!

First, choose the fund(s) you'd like to contribute to. While there are many, we would encourage the: The **Deacon's Assistance Fund** or The **Birthday Fund**. The Deacon's Assistance Fund helps to provide financial assistance to individuals and families who are in need. Trinity's Birthday Fund provides monetary support to those ministries and community organizations with whom we partner in mission.

Second, make an "over-and-above" contribution. There are a few ways you can do this.

- 1) You can simply place your check/cash offering in the GivingTuesday envelopes provided. Make checks payable to Trinity Presbyterian Church and mark "GIVINGTUESDAY" in the MEMO. When complete, you may drop it in the offering plate, or drop it off or mail it to the Church Office.
- 2) You can scan the QR Code provided, select the desired fund, and make payment by either using a credit/debit card or your bank account information.
