

Trinity finished 2023 in good financial condition. Our staff vacancy and careful spending led to expenses that were \$8724 under budget. Our revenue was \$9802 under budget, but this was due to a Session decision not to use \$10,000 of investment returns for revenue. At the end of the year, we were also able to spend some money for a few long-term needs, such as cleaning and waxing our tile floors. Overall, Trinity ended the year with expenses only \$1078 (0.3%) higher than revenue. Thank you for your continued financial support for all of our important Trinity missions.

Our 2024 Stewardship campaign provided 98 pledges for a total of \$204,678. While we have fewer pledges than in 2023, the amount of money pledged increased substantially year over year. Based on this, Session adopted a balanced budget of \$352,100 for 2024. This includes use of \$72,839 from Heritage Fund and \$10,000 of investment returns. If you still need to pledge, simply mail your pledge card to the church or put it in the offering plate. Extra pledge cards are available in the office.

#### PER CAPITA AND UNIFIED GIVING EXPLANATION

Per Capita means per member.

The Per Capita funding provides needed money for all of PC USA to remain connected and help one another. For 2024 the per capita assessment

is **\$9.85 for each individual member** of the church.

Our local St Augustine Presbytery, which supports Trinity and our 53 sister churches in many ways, is funded through Unified Giving. Unified Giving is a pledge from Trinity, and for 2024 we are **pledging an amount equal to the** 

**Per Capita which would be \$9.85 per individual member** of our congregation.
