Finance Update

Annual Budget - For the first quarter of 2024 our annual budget revenue, excluding the supplement from the Heritage Fund, was \$74,131.71 and our expenses were \$75,113.21.

Capital Roof Campaign – The receipts are \$148,346 which includes \$88,945 from the initial campaign and \$59,401 from pledges paid. There are \$25,199 in pledges outstanding. Thanks to all who have contributed to this campaign. We are still in need of approximately \$40,000 to pay off the loan in the next few years and ask that you prayerfully consider an increased or new pledge/contribution.

I believe that **Stewardship is mor**e than money, budgets, and paying bills! The **Heritage Fund** was started by generous gifts from Trinity Stewards. Finance Committee and Session try to consider the best ways for us to use the Fund to share God's love at Trinity. Since our pledges for the operating budget have not covered our expenses for the past several years, we have used the Heritage Fund to balance the budget. The Finance Committee and Session have done their best to address the shortfalls. We have asked the committees to do their best to budget only for

needs and watch their expenses. Stewards that they are, they worked hard with what they had. Then we invested part of what had been given to the Heritage Fund. Our hope is that we can encourage others to give to the Fund and we eventually can use the earnings to balance the budget instead of the fund itself.








Check Out This New Book

May Gathering was held on May 1, 2024 in Mehaffey Hall.

Terri Belletto from Flagler Free Clinic was our guest speaker at the PW May Gathering. The Flagler Free Clinic is a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing high quality health care to the uninsured and economically challenged residents of Flagler and Volusia counties. Patients make appointments to see PAs and Doctors who volunteer their time. The clinic has over 60 volunteers, three are members of Trinity. Advent Health provides labs and x-rays when needed. Terri was most informative and invited us to come out to Bunnell for a tour of the facility. Ladies attending the Gathering brought the following items Tylenol, 81 mg EC aspirin, bandages, Advil, cough and cold, creams for itching, and other first aid items to give to the clinic. The free clinic gives these items to their client. The Flagler Free Clinic is funded through grants and the kindness of people like us. We collected \$307 to give to the clinic.

At our May Gathering and Circle meetings, we receive the PW Birthday offering. The Birthday Offering gives women a tangible way to celebrate the blessings in their lives by giving to these PW projects. This year there are two projects funded by these gifts: Bethel Hills Villa Apartments and Recreation Area in Marthasville, Missouri and Café Ginkgo in Louisville, Kentucky. We don't have a total donation amount collected yet because Circles will meet following the Times deadline and they will add to our collection (\$241) from the Gathering.

The **Bethel Hills renovation of villas** addressed the unique needs of individuals with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities by providing a safe and loving place that takes into consideration their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs in an environment where they can flourish, feel accepted and valued.

The Cafe Gingko at Shawnee Presbyterian Church serves an economically disadvantaged area where single mothers and children face challenges of food insecurity. Following the grant funded by the offering, the church has opened a renovated kitchen and expanded capacity to allow them to offer enriching activities for children, financial literacy classes and Mama-to-Mama parenting workshops along with dine-in meals.




